9 Never Promised You A Rose Garden by Hooker Leo

This design was inspired by my cousin, who requested this scarf a while ago, and I'll admit, I was intimidated by possible design until such time it came to me and I was able to make the scarf over a 48-hour period. I was not happy with many of the rose patterns I found, so this recipe includes another rose pattern. Keep in mind that this is a recipe. I did not record how much yarn I used, but you should be able to make the scarf with one red skein and one green skein of approximately 300 yards, each.

Legend

PM = Place Marker SC = Single Crochet CH = Chain

ST(S) = Stitch(es) DC = Double Crochet HDC = Half Double Crochet

HTC = Half Treble Crochet TC = Treble Crochet SS = Slip Stitch

Materials

1 skein Red Heart Super Saver
Colors: 0319 Cherry Red & 0389 Hunter Green; Content: 100% Acrylic; Weight: 4,
Worsted Weight

Hook: Boye US G/6 - 4.0 mm

Tapestry Needle

Snippers

Recipe

IMPORTANT

Know the person's height and then decide on how many roses you will need to attach, keeping in mind the ends will be for the buds.

NODES

It's good to know where your rose placements are going to be ahead of time so that you can crochet little nodes while making the vine. Where I am planning to place my roses, I created a little nodes by placing 3 single crochets in one single crochet. Ideally, you also want to place nodes on each of the three sides of your vine.

VINE

Follow general guidelines and make the length of the scarf equal to the person's height. Keep in mind that you can adjust the length to accommodate your rose spacing. I placed my roses about twelve inches apart. You will be working around the foundation chain in the front loops, back loops and bottom loop

Row 1: sc front loop of vine length foundation chain

Row 2: sc in the back loop of vine length foundation chain

Row 3: sc in bottom loop of vine length foundation chain

ROSES

I modified the <u>Mother's Day Crochet Rose</u> pattern. I also modified the sepals for the buds to be smaller using single crochet base round for the smaller bud and half double crochet base round for the larger bud.

BUDS

Rosebud and Leaf Pattern by Petals to Picots

Ch 56.

Row 1: Sc in second st from hook and back to beginning (55 sc). Ch 1 and turn.

Row 2: Sc in first st, skip 2 sts, * 7 dc in next st, skip 2 sts, sc in next st. * (Repeat* to * 3 times). Skip 2 sts, * 9 dc in next st, skip 2 sts, sc in next st. * (Repeat* to * 3 times). Skip 2 sts, * 11 dc in next st, skip 2 sts. * (Repeat * to * 3 times) Sc in last st.

Roll rose up and stitch through bottom sc ch to secure, using ends. Use remaining ends - if sufficient - attaching roses to middle st of 3 sc node, along vine.

LEAVES

Make 16: two sets of 8 in color green

Ch 7

SS second chain from hook, sc, hdc, dc, htc, 5 tc, ch 5, turn, ss in second chain from hook and next three stitches, 5 tc in same stitch as previous 5 tc, htc, dc, hd, sc, ss.

Fasten off, using leaf ends to attach to either side of rose of 3 sc nodes or roses, along vine.
