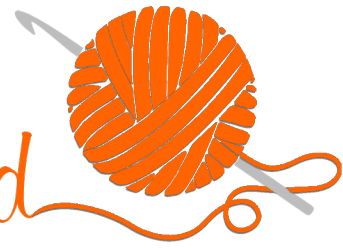


A Hooker's World



How Deep Is The Ocean

This scarf was created as further exploration into crochet short rows, after having recently learned knit short rows. I found that my special stitch - the Single Crochet Bar Front Loop - really compliments the gradient yarns. Above are some example using yarns with short color runs versus long color runs. The instructions are very basic, providing you with the opportunity to improvise.

Materials

- Approximately 800 yards of the worsted weight yarn of your choice
- Pictured:
 - Jean Genie:** Newton's Yarn Country Kroy Pencil Roving
 - How Deep Is The Ocean:** Newton's Yarn Country Kroy Pencil Roving
 - You're My Magician:** Universal Classic Shades (736 Neon Lime Surprise)
 - September:** Universal Classic Shades (706 Sundown)
- US H /8 Hook
- Tapestry Needle

Legend

CH = Chain SC = Single Crochet

SCBFL = Single Crochet Bar Front Loop STS = Stitches

SCBL = Single Crochet Bar Loop

Special Stitches

Single Crochet Bar Front Loop (SCBFL): only possible on the back/wrong/left side of your work: single crochet through the front loop and the bar just below the front loop.

Single Crochet Back Loop (SCBL): single crochet through back loop

Finished Size

Approximately 72 x 6 inches

Instructions

CH 25, or multiple of 3 + 1 for a wider scarf.

Foundation Row: SC in the bottom bump of second chain from hook (for a nicer edge) and each bump across (24 SC). CH 1 and turn.

Short Row 1: SCBFL in each stitch across, leaving last 3 STS unworked (21 SCBFL). CH 1 and turn.

Short Row 2: SCBFL back (21 STS)

Repeat Short Rows 1 & 2 (7 more times, shorting each row by 3 STS) until you have worked all STS across, after which you should have steps across the width of your scarf.

Crochet Short Rows: ScBL across in all STS. (24 SCBL). CH 1 and turn.
You should have a triangle now. Repeat Short Row instructions to desired length.
