

# A Hooker's World



*Come And Get Your Love*

This pattern is very easy and should work up quickly. I made mine in one 24-hour period. I'd been itching to make another Mobius cowl since [Pick Up The Pieces](#), and Sara inspired me with her shared knowledge of the Sedge Stitch a la Lion Brand.

## Yarn Pictured

- Yarn A: Lion Brand Jamie (200 White); 100% Acrylic, Triple Stranded
- Yarn B: Unknown Eyelash (White); Unknown fiber
- Yarn C: Plassard Insolite (09 Lavender); 100% Polyester
- Yarn D: Flutter (42); 100% Polyester
- Yarn E: Classic Elite La Gran Mohair (6589 Crepe Myrtle); 78.4% Mohair/17.3% Wool/4.3% Nylon

## Materials

- Yarn A: Yarn Weight: 2; 196 yards or 50 grams or 1.75 ounces per skein (3 skeins)
- Yarn B: Yarn Weight: carry along; Body + Border: 300 yards or 75 grams or 2.62 ounces; Border Only: 75 yards or 20 grams
- Yarn C: Border Only: Yarn Weight: carry along; 75 yards or 20 grams; Color: 09 Lavender (Estimate) Yarn D: Yarn Weight: carry along; Border Only: 75 yards or 20 grams; Color: 42 (Estimate)
- Yarn E: Border Only: Yarn Weight: unknown; 75 yards or 20 grams; Color: 6589 Crepe Myrtle (Estimate)
- Hook: US M/13-9.0 mm & US I/9-6.0 mm
- Tapestry Needle
- Snippers, as necessary

## Finished Size

6 inch width x 22.5 inch diameter  $\approx$  70.6 circumference

## Special Stitch

Sedge Stitch (based on multiple of 3 stitches)

**Row 1:** Skip 2 chains (counts as single crochet), work 2 double crochet in next chain, \*skip 2 chains, work (single crochet, 2 double crochet) in next chain; repeat from \* to last 3 chains, skip 2 chains, single crochet in last chain – 10 (single crochet, 2 double crochet) pattern repeats.

**Row 2:** Chain 1 (counts as single crochet), do not turn because we are working in the round, 2 double crochet in first single crochet, \*skip 2 double crochet, (single crochet, 2

double crochet) in next single crochet; repeat from \* across, single crochet in turning chain.

## Instructions

Foundation Chain: I started with a foundation chain of 99, as I only had partial skeins. Unless you are good at estimation, stick to the instructions and you'll have leftovers. Turn one end 180° and close with slip stitch. If you wish a larger circumference, just make sure your foundation chain is a multiple of 3.

## Body

**Round 1:** Crochet in sedge stitch into top of chain back to the beginning, continuing on bottom of chain, and closing round with slip stitch in first sc.

**Round 2:** Follow instruction for Row 2, but do not turn work, as you are working in the round. Repeat Round 2 to desired width

## Border

Using Yarns B, C, D & E, slip stitch both sides of the top of each stitch around. Instead of fastening off, I simply turned my work and started on the opposite loop. If you are not able to manage that movement, you may fasten off and resume on the opposite loop afresh.

## Finishing

Here's where the tapestry needle comes into play - use it to sew in all ends you have not already crocheted in. Use the snippers to cut any excess. I like to use a small hook to pull out any visible eyelash loops.
